



INVESTMENT STRATEGY AND PROCESS

Lester Asset Management Inc. ("LAM") launched an actively managed All-Cap Canadian Equity strategy for its segregated accounts in July 2006 and created a pooled version through the LAM Canadian Equity Fund (the "Fund") in January 2012. The strategy's aim is to be different from the S&P/TSX Composite Index and achieve higher returns than the market with lower risk as measured by low market correlation, low cyclical exposure, and better industry diversification. The portfolio is invested in 40 to 50 small, mid and large cap Canadian listed companies selected using a research process based on fundamental bottom-up analysis, strict quantitative and qualitative criteria, and a sound understanding of each company and the industry in which each operates, complemented by a macro-economic outlook. The investment style is value-driven and opportunistic, seeking to buy shares at a discount to a company's true worth, with the goal of maximizing shareholder value through dividend growth, share buybacks, spin-offs or an outright sale.

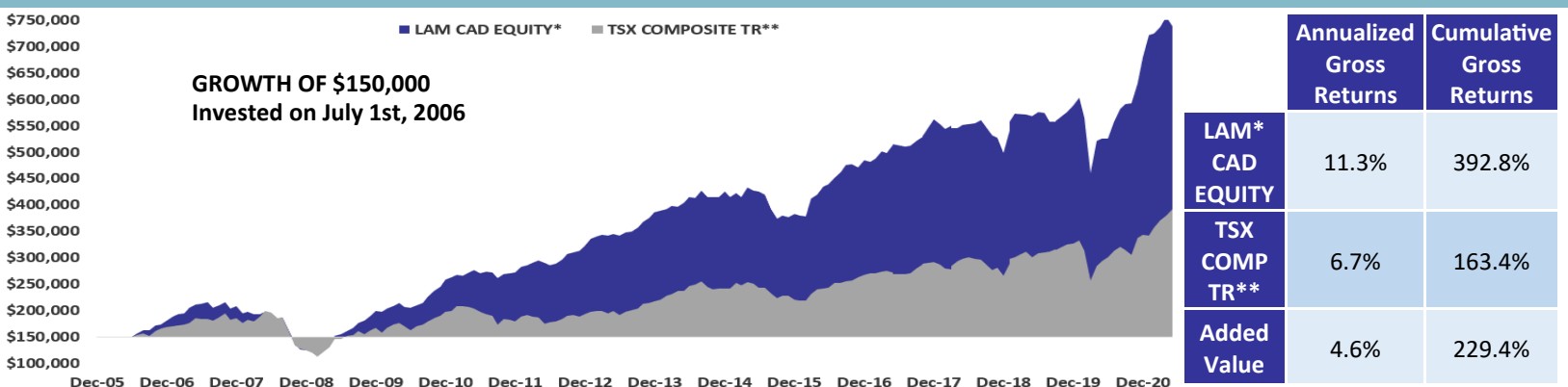

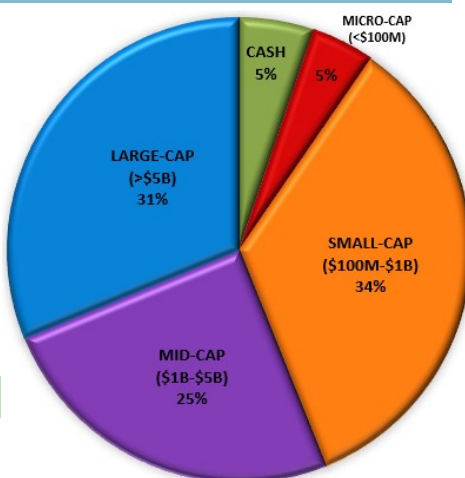

MONTHLY COMMENTARY

The **LAM Canadian Equity Fund** declined **-2.3%** on a gross basis during the month versus +3.4% for the TSX Composite Total Return. Year-to-date, the Fund is up **+8.8%** versus +14.4% for the TSX. Most world stock markets continued to rise in anticipation of a strong economic recovery following the roll-out of vaccinations, although the technology heavy NASDAQ was down -1.4%. We underperformed in part due to our technology holdings, but mainly as a result of our lack of exposure to the Gold and Materials sectors which rose +12.2% and +8.7% respectively, and our underweighting in the Financial sector which rose +4.9%. Our investment philosophy is to maintain low exposure to cyclical and high market correlation sectors, so we will underperform in times when commodity and financial stocks are rising. Positive contributors included **Sienna Senior Living, Loblaw, LifeWorks** (formerly Morneau Shepell) and **Keyera**. Detractors included technology companies such as **MDF Commerce** and **Tecsys**, renewable power producers **Algonquin** and **Boralex**, and small caps such as **CareRX** and **Baylin**. Each of these companies' share prices pulled back sharply after strong gains earlier in the year. We took advantage of dips to add to many of our core holdings like **CN Rail, Boralex, Innergex, Savaria, Park Lawn, Ag Growth** and **Stella Jones**, while taking some profits in **Pollard Banknote, CAP REIT** and some of our Energy sector holdings. While June is off to a strong start for our portfolio, we continue to hold a large cash balance awaiting more attractively priced opportunities.
