INVESTMENT STRATEGY AND PROCESS

Lester Asset Management Inc. ("LAM") launched an actively managed All-Cap Canadian Equity strategy for its segregated accounts in July 2006 and created a pooled version through the Lester Canadian Equity Fund (the "Fund") in January 2012. The strategy's aim is to be different from the S&P/TSX Composite Index and achieve higher returns than the market with lower risk as measured by low market correlation, low cyclical exposure, and better industry diversification. The portfolio is invested in 40 to 50 small, mid and large cap Canadian listed companies selected using a research process based on fundamental bottom-up analysis, strict quantitative and qualitative criteria, and a sound understanding of each company and the industry in which each operates, complemented by a macro-economic outlook. The investment style is value-driven and opportunistic, seeking to buy shares at a discount to a company's true worth, with the goal of maximizing shareholder value through dividend growth, share buybacks, spin-offs or an outright sale.

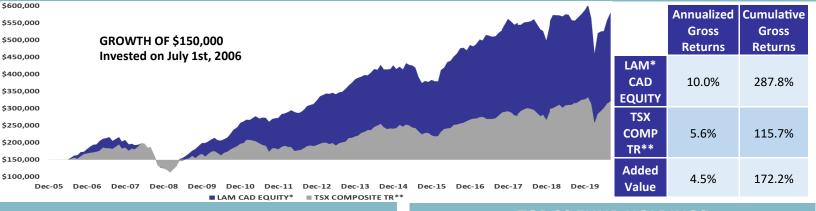

MONTHLY COMMENTARY

The Canadian Equity Fund rose **+4.3%** on a gross basis during the month versus **+2.4%** for the TSX Composite Total Return (including dividends) as global stock markets continued to recover from their March lows on better than expected corporate earnings. Year-to-date, the Fund is down **-1%** versus **-1.1%** for the TSX. While we are underweight the Financial and Energy sectors which were the main drivers of the TSX during the month, we still handily outperformed the index thanks to solid second quarter earnings from many of our small and mid cap holdings. These included Badger Daylighting, Altus Group, Stella Jones, Keyera, Guardian Capital, K-Bro Linen, Savaria, Park Lawn, Pollard Banknote and Calian Group. Our slight outperformance year-to-date versus the TSX is particularly satisfying given that we do not own any gold stocks or Shopify, without which the TSX would be down over **-8%** in 2020. Record low interest rates, government stimulus, and the re-opening of most businesses continue to buoy markets. While corporate earnings have been better than expected, many were bolstered by wage subsidies and massive cost cutting which has resulted in high unemployment. We therefore continue to take a cautious approach by holding more defensive names and a higher cash balance in case the economic recovery stalls or there is a second wave of the virus resulting in further lock-downs.
